# **Internship Opportunities**

Students with a minor in Child Advocacy are required to complete a three-credit hour internship. The students will have hands-on internship opportunities that are available through numerous agencies working directly with child welfare, such as the Department of Social Services (DSS), the Child Advocacy Center (CAC), First Steps Early Head Start, Pendleton Place for Children and Families. The Boys and Girls Club and various Spartanburg School Districts. The internships are a great opportunity for students to get experience in fields that they are interested in pursuing.
