USC Upstate and Dorman High School are collaborating on dual credit courses in anatomy and physiology that will count toward the credits needed for a bachelor of science in nursing.

Why it matters: High school seniors who take the courses will get a jump on their nursing studies. Those who take additional dual credit courses, such as English and college math, can satisfy other first-semester requirements and enter Upstate as second-semester freshmen.

In Brief

Tierney Bates, vice chancellor for Student Affairs, was one of 30 senior-level higher education professionals selected to participate in the 2024-25 Millennium Leadership Initiative by the American Association of State Colleges and Universities (AASCU).

John Montemayor, TRIO director, and Josh Ruppel, director of research and professor of chemistry, were selected to participate in the AASCU Emerging Leaders Program.

Tina Herzberg, professor and director of the visual impairment program, received the 2024 Corinne Kirchner Research Award from the American Foundation for the Blind. The award is given to a leading scholar in the field of blindness and low vision who has made significant contributions to research.

Kim Shorter, associate professor of biology, received a \$517,500 grant for research on a small gene's effects on gene expression and epigenetics related to cancer and autism. The grant will allow students assisting in the research to be paid for their work during the academic year and summer.

Lana Cromenes, adjunct instructor of American Sign Language, collaborated with **Lee Neibert**, professor of theatre, on a public interpreting project. After practicing at dress rehearsals, Cromenes' ASL students provided interpreting for the spring production of "A Midsummer Night's Dream." Students from the South Carolina School for the Deaf and the Blind attended the performance.
