## Spring 2023 CRJU 399 – Independent Study

Service Learning – Beauty Marks 4 Girls Mentoring - Qualitative Student research gathering information on the effects of maternal incarceration on children and apply this knowledge through the non profit organization Beauty Marks 4 Girls with real-life mentoring of a young girl who has a mother currently in prison. Weekly meetings were held between the student and program participant. In addition to weekly phone meetings, the student also joined monthly in-person activities with other participants and tracked weekly journal entries reflecting thoughts on these activities. Included in the journaling were ideas on what did and did not go well, thoughts on the student's development in terms of equity and inclusion, as well as a comparison to what was found in the literature review.

## Spring 2023 CRJU 399 – Independent Study

## Course Design in Criminal Justice - Quantitative

Students surveyed criminal justice majors and minors regarding their opinions about course material delivery and assessment. The survey included questions regarding course modality, experiential and active learning, and assessment practices. Students were also asked about barriers to learning, such as time spent working, textbook costs, and caregiving. Findings indicate that the regional

comprehensive student faces many barriers to learning, which instructors should consider as they design assignments and choose course modality.
