

IMPORTANT INFORMATION FOR STUDENTS REGARDING DUAL ENROLLMENT COURSES OFFERED BY UNIVERSITY OF SOUTH CAROLINA UPSTATE

You are seeking to be enrolled in a course that may allow for dual credit in your high school and/or at the collegiate level.

- Enrollment in a dual enrollment course does not imply acceptance into the University of South Carolina Upstate for anything other than the dual enrollment course (enrollment is specific to the specific course).
- The grade received in the course may be used in any GPA calculation including those for South Carolina's publicly funded scholarship programs.
- Credit earned by satisfactory completion of dual enrollment courses will transfer to <u>public</u> South Carolina institutions, provided that the course is included on the List of Transferable Courses in the Statewide Transfer and Articulation Policy (http://www.che.sc.gov/AcademicAffairs/TRANSFER/Transfer.htm). If the course is not included on the list, you are responsible for contacting the receiving higher education institution to see if it will accept the course credit. It's a good idea to get this in writing. We recommend doing this before you enroll in the dual enrollment course.
- If you plan on attending a <u>private</u> institution in South Carolina or any public or private institution <u>outside</u> of South Carolina, they may not accept this dual enrollment credit. We recommend that you contact the institution and get written assurance that they will apply the dual enrollment course towards their degree requirements.
